Mandate (PD 205)



1

To foster and support the development forces at work in the nation's economy through selective human resources development programs, research, data collection, and information services, to the end that optimization of wealth may be achieved in a manner congruent with the maximization of public security and welfare;

Mandate (PD 205)



2

To promote, carry on and conduct scientific, interdisciplinary and policy-oriented research education, training, consultancy, and publication in the broad fields of economics, public administration, and the political and social sciences, generally, involving the study, determination, interpretation, and publication of economic, political, and social facts and principles bearing upon development problems of local, national, or international significance; and

Mandate (PD 205)



To discharge a regional role in initiating and catalyzing exchange of ideas and expertise on development activities in the region of Asian and the Far East.







The establishment of Centers of Excellence is a key strategy adopted by the Asian Productivity Organization (APO) to propagate best practices and further strengthen national productivity organization in areas where they possess unique strengths and expertise.





Among others, the Center of Excellence (COE) in Public Sector Productivity (PSP) aims to:

A. Assist APO in advancing the public sector productivity movement in the Asia and the Pacific region

C. Foster cutting-edge research, facilitate training and knowledge-sharing, and support outreach to APO member countries in raising productivity of the public sector organizations in the region

B. Help address common and critical issues on public sector productivity performance besetting the APO member countries

D. Serve as hub of a web of collaborators on innovation and productivity in the public sector

- Career Executive Service Development Program (CESDP) is now the Career Executive Service Board (CESB) to address the need to professionalize the bureaurcracy and to institute a career system in the senior level of government.
- 2. Career Foreign Service Development Program is now the **Foreign Service Institute (FSI)** of DFA is likewise an action research initiave that aimed to professionalize the corps of foreign service officers.
- 3. Social Indicators (SI) is now the Social Weather Station (SWS) and the Pulse Asia is an an action research initiave aimed at the determining the perception and impulse of the general public on specific or general issues.
- 4. Medium and Small Scale Industry Assistance Program (MASICAP) is now the Bureau of Micro, Small & Medium Enterprise Development (BMSMED) of the Department of Trade and Industry (DTI) aimed to address the need to encourage and boost the development of community-based enterprises that would eventually result to job generation and increase in economic activities in specific areas.





- 5. Fisheries Integrated Resources Management (FIRM) Program was absorbed by the Bureau of Fisheries & Aquatic Resources (BFAR) of the Department of Agriculture (DA) aimed to come-up with a mechanism to rationalization of the abundant aquatic resources of the country.
- 6. Tondo Foreshore Development Program evolved into the **Metro Manila Development Authority (MMDA)**
- 7. Olongapo Development Plan made for Olongapo City became the **Subic Bay Metropolitan Authority (SBMA)**
- 8. Program for Decentralized Educational Development (PRODED) metamorphosed into the **National Educators Academy of the Philippines (NEAP)** of the Department of Education (DepEd)
- 9. Youth and Sports Development (YSD) Program became the blueprint which led to the creation Kabataang Barangay which is now the Sangguniang Kabataan and the **National Youth Commission (NYC)**

- 10. Barefoot Doctors Program is now Doctors to the **Barrio Program of the Department of Health (DOH)**
- 11. Integrated Area Development Program (IADP) and Rural Development Program (RDP) developed into a Task Force on Human Settlements (TFHS) which became the **Human Settlements Commission**, the Human Settlements Development Corporation and eventually the **Ministry of Human Settlements**, from which other new ideas and institutions came about, e.g. the Technology Resource Center (TRC), the Pag-IBIG Fund, the Housing and Land Use Regulatory Board (HLURB) and others.
